





## Introduction

The Republic of Singapore is a global city and sovereign state in Southeast Asia and the world's only islandcity-state. It gained independence from Britain in 1963, by uniting with other former British territories to form Malaysia, but was expelled two years later over ideological differences. After early years of turbulence, and despite lacking natural resources and a hinterland, the nation developed rapidly as an Asian Tiger economy, based on external trade and its human capital.

Singapore is a global commerce, finance and transport hub. Its standings include: "easiest place to do business" (World Bank) ten consecutive years. "technology-ready" nation (WEF). dot International-meetings city (UIA), city with "best investment potential" (BERI), 2nd-most competitive country(WEF), 3rd-laraest 3rd-laraest foreian exchange center. financial centre, 3rd-largest oil refining and tradinacentre and one of the top two busiest container ports since the 1990s. Singapore's best known alobal brands include Singapore Airlines and Changi Airport, both amongst the most-awarded in their industry: SIA is also rated by Fortune surveys as Asia's "most admired company". For the past decade, it has been the only Asian country with the top AAA sovereign rating from all major credit rating agencies. including S&P. Moody's and Fitch, Singapore is a safe land for migrants workers. About 1.4 m foreign workers have been working in Singapore, among them 160 Thousand are Banaladeshi.


